

# Critical Elements to Starting Chapter

- Identify a niche
- Be affiliated with a university
  - Students have the most time and energy
  - SCB is academic in nature
- Find the 'right' people
  - Dedicated: quality of volunteers, not quantity
  - Proactive: do what needs to be done



#### 'Logistical' Critical Elements

- Keep good recording system
- Watch finances; open bank account asap
- Find volunteer capacity via internships, coop placements
- Plan events well in advance
- Advertise activities: newsgroup, on campus,
   & throughout local enviro community



#### 'Long Hall' Critical Elements

- Connect with local enviro community
- Seek support of more experienced local NGOs, Chapters, and SCB Main
- Maintain regular communication with executive and members (even if just email updates)
- Be creative have fun



#### Notes on Funding

- Volunteering has its rewards, but they are not financial!
- Symposium can earn money
- Don't be afraid to ask for corporate sponsorship – donated items
- Apply for grants
- Network connections are critical
